In 1978, we started our Japanese language education to create a multicultural society where we can live together. ### (I) ONE-YEAR JAPANESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM

- JI Elementary level (6 months)
- J2 Pre-Intermediate level (6 months)

Course subjects: Comprehensive Japanese, Kanji and Vocabulary, Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking, Special Activities

The goal is to acquire basic Japanese language skills and practical communication abilities through life in Japan. Through activities such as scenario plays for producing mini-dramas, interactions with the local community, and experiential lessons for understanding Japanese culture, one can deepen their understanding of Japanese society and culture.

### 2 ONE-YEAR JAPANESE LANGUAGE PROGRAM FOR CAREER PREPARATION

- J3 Intermediate level (6 months)
- J4 Advanced level (6 months)

Course subjects: Comprehensive Japanese, Kanji and Vocabulary, Reading, Writing, Listening, Presentation, Career Planning, Special Activities

The goal is to acquire advanced Japanese language skills for social activities. Through internships and job interviews, one will learn about Japanese society and ways of thinking. To cultivate self-expression skill and adjustment abilities, one will engage in many presentations and group work activities.

# <career counseling>

We support students who would like to apply to universities, apply to vocational schools or work in Japan. We advise on how to choose schools and offer support during the application process. We also provide instruction on the writing and interview process. Upon your request, you can take a writing test prep class such as EJU required by universities in Japan.

# 9. Refund policy

- (1) The screening fee and admission fee will not be refunded under any circumstances.
- (2) If you are subject to forced removal or expulsion, the fee paid will not be refunded.
- (3) In cases where classes are canceled due to unavoidable circumstances such as natural disasters, accidents, infectious diseases, or strikes by transportation services, the fees paid will not be refunded.
- (4) If you are able to decline enrollment by the day of the entrance ceremony, fees for tuition, teaching materials, practical training and facility costs will be refunded.
- (5) In the case of withdrawal after enrollment, a refund will not be made under the following conditions.

### Requirements

If the withdrawal notice is submitted and the student ID is returned, any tuition fees for unattended classes will be refunded. At that time, a cancellation fee\* will be deducted. Fees for teaching materials, practical training, and facility expenses will not be refunded.

\*How to calculate cancellation fee

Subtract the tuition fees for the classes attended from the total tuition fees, and calculate the amount for the classes not attended. The cancellation fee will be 20% of the amount for the classes not attended. The maximum cancellation fee will be 50,000 yen.

# 10. School life

- Please attend classes every day without being late or absent. Please make your time at home to do lots of homework after the class.
- Students will receive diplomas when students have enrolled in YWCA for I year and meet the completions requirements. In case of learning for 6 months, students can't receive diploma.
- · If you enroll as J2 (intermediate), J4 (advanced) class, and meet the completions requirements, you can receive certificate of completion.

# II. Completion requirements

Graduation certificates will be awarded to students who meet the following criteria:

- ·Must be enrolled until the final day of the course.
- ·Must have taken the final exam.
- ·Must have an attendance rate of 80% or higher for the entire course and the subject "Special Activities" must be judged as passed.
- ·Must have a grade of C or higher in all subjects.
- ·Must have paid all tuition fees in full.

# 12. Support system

# (I) scholarship

The Nagoya YWCA School of Japanese Language has its own scholarship system.

Students selected as scholarship recipients will receive a total of 90,000 yen for six months.

#### (2) Perfect Attendance Award • Effort Award

Students with perfect attendance will receive the Attendance Award, and those with very few absences will receive the Effort Award.

# (3) Student Commuter Pass

Those who use public transportations (for example Nagoya Municipal Subway, Nagoya Municipal Bus, JR-line, Meitetsu-line, Kintetsu-line etc.) are eligible to apply for a student discount for a commuter pass.
